- -James is the half-brother of Jesus.
- -James struggled to believe his brother Jesus while Jesus was alive. (John 5:7)
- -Jesus appeared to James after His resurrection.
- -James was the leader of the church in Jerusalem and known throughout church history as a man of extreme prayer.
- -He was one of the first martyrs for the Faith.

The Why Behind the Letter:

- -James' hope was to address the 12 tribes of Israel that had converted from ancient Judaism to following Jesus.
- -His letter helped followers to establish a real faith in following the way of Jesus.

Two Faith Imposters Marketed in Our Culture:

- 1) Faith that earns a way to being in God's good graces.
- 2) Faith without deeds.
